WHEREAS, after a public hearing on December 6, 2006, as set forth in the Resolution adopted on said date, the Northwest Bergen County Utilities Authority (the "Authority") determined that it would be in the best interest of the public and the local government units it serves to institute a connection fee program in the manner prescribed by <u>N.J.S.A</u>. 40:14B-23, and to adopt the necessary amendments to the Authority's Rules, Regulations and Standards required to implement the connection fee program; and

NECESSITY FOR CHANGE AND REASON FOR OMISSION FROM PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS: There were spoils within the work area at the Compost that had to be moved to pass machines through for the excavation of one of the jacking pits. This involved two full days of work and multiple Jersey barriers to blockade the spoils. The spoils removed belonged to and were the responsibility of the Borough of Waldwick as is the property for the work area in question. However, the Borough would not have been able to remove the spoils for weeks thereby delaying the start of the project Next, the 60-foot tree in the resident's backyard had to be taken down because it was found during excavation that the tree roots grew directly through the proposed excavation area and would need to be severed. The tree would have been at a severe risk of falling if it was not removed. Had the tree not been removed and it fell the damage would have been extreme. For Item No. 3, the existing Chamber MHE6 was determined to be in very poor structural condition upon excavation for the slip lining work. The reinforced concrete walls had visible rebars present and were in danger of collapsing because of the high hydrogen sulfide concentrations. The chamber was in too poor shape to perform a rehab. Therefore, the manhole was replaced since there was already a bypass system in place for the slip-line work. Next, the residential brick paver walkway removed during excavation had to be replaced. The lawns also had to be re-graded and restored. Finally, the residential fence had to be replaced because it was removed and damaged for the jacking pit and

PROPOSED SANITARY SEWER EXTENSION 720 HICKORY HILL ROAD TOWNSHIP OF WYCKOFF, NEW JERSEY

WHEREAS, an application has been made to the Northwest Bergen County Utilities Authority (hereinafter sometimes referred to as the "Authority") by Dan Kindergan on behalf of the Township of Wyckoff (hereinafter referred to as the "Applicant") for approval of a proposed sanitary sewer extension to be located at 720 Hickory Hill Road in the Township of Wyckoff (hereinafter referred to as the "Project"); and
