WHEREAS, Gingerelli Bros. submitted a bid which includes one (\$0.01) cent for concrete repairs by the square foot or square yard, which the Authority determines in accordance with the bid documents to be materially unbalanced and therefore unresponsive; and

WHEREAS, Gingerelli Bros. did not list in their Statement of Experience and Qualifications any work experience of similar nature to that of the proposed work. A request for supplemental information was made to Gingerelli Bros. and it responded that it provides general contracting services and are seeking to start to performing work in the wastewater sector. The sludge collection system is a key component of the Authority's wastewater treatment process. Failure of this system could result in problems with downstream processes and ultimately could result in permit violations. Accordingly, the Authority finds that Gingerelli Bros. has failed to submit qualifications sufficient to allow the Authority to make a determination that the bidder is qualified and responsible enough to undertake the contract; and

WHEREAS, Rapid Pump & Meter's list of past and current contracts lacks a list of "personnel demonstrating its ability to perform the work". However, it has done prior work for the Authority and other authorities which satisfies the Authority as to its ability to perform the work and this may be waived; and
