WHEREAS, pursuant to said statutory authorization and Service Contracts, the Northwest Bergen County Utilities Authority adopted a budget for the fiscal year of January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021, making provision for the payment of \$13,468,465, being the amount that the Authority estimates will be required (in addition to other funds on hand applicable for such purposes) to be paid by said municipalities during the current fiscal year January 1, 2021 to December 31, 2021, as and for security of payment of principal and interest on outstanding bonds or other obligations authorized by said statutes and service contracts, and for the cost of operation, depreciation, and repair of the district's sewer system including establishment and maintenance of working capital and reserves; and

WHEREAS, the above stated Statutes and Service Contracts provide that the Authority may prescribe the amounts to be charged for the discharge and disposal of sewage through the district sewer system pursuant to N.J.S.A.14:14B-22 and N.J.S.A.14:14B-23 and related statutes thereto; and

WHEREAS, the said Resolution further provided that, effective January 1, 1987, User Service Charges be calculated according to a formula in which 60% of User Service Charges are based on adjusted metered flow, 20% are based on water connections and 20% are based on water usage (the 60-20-20 Formula).
